

I am pleased to announce that Ngāti Tūwharetoa Fisheries Charitable Trust is piloting a new project in 2021 called Ka hao te rangatahi: Ngāti Tūwharetoa Rangatahi Trip to Nelson.

We want to show rangatahi what success looks like and provide exposure around various options in the fishing industry.  - demonstrate a commitment to their iwi, hapu and whanau

 - a copy of your photo I.D (driver's license or passport) for booking flights
